This **CALIFORNIA SPECIALTIES TRIP LIST** is designed for birders interested in VENT tours to Southern California led by Jeri M. Langham. It includes all species that have been seen and/or just heard by the 12 previous tours led by Brad Schram and those seen and/or just heard on my three tours. The order of families and common names in my Trip List are those given by the American Ornithologists' Union *Check-list of North American Birds*, 7<sup>th</sup> edition and incorporates changes through the 49<sup>th</sup> Supplement. I added a mammal list at the end of page 9.

Those species whose names are preceded by an asterisk are of special interest to the California Bird Records Committee. They range from a single record to less than an average of five records per year. Please document any sightings of these species with a photograph and/or a written description and send it/them to the current CBRC secretary: Guy McCaskie, CBRC Secretary, P.O. Box 275, Imperial Beach, CA 91933-0275 or by e-mail at guymcc@pacbell.net.

Before signing up for a tour, many participants like to know their chances of seeing certain birds. **Column I** indicates how many of the **FIFTEEN previous tours** have seen each species. This number provides a very realistic idea of your chances of seeing your most wanted California birds. **Column II** indicates the *species seen (x) or only heard (h) in 2011, the THIRD time I have led this tour*. A + indicates that we saw a race that might be elevated to species status in future years. We have only been keeping records for mammals during the last eight years; therefore, **Column I** on page 9 indicates how many of our NINE previous tours have seen each mammal species.

**Because none of my participants in 2009 had a camera with a big lens, page 3 is designed with photographs taken over the years by my friend Peter LaTourrette. You can see ALL of Peter's photos at <http://birdphotography.com/>.** For a print-ready file (not for the print itself) and for personal (non-commercial) use only, Peter charges a very modest \$25 for a high-resolution page size jpg. In 2010, Billy Fuller had a small camera with a zoom lens and I used some photos taken by him for page 4.

Sometime after you sign up for **CALIFORNIA SPECIALTIES**, I will mail you the official, bound Field Checklist that we will use each evening to keep records of what we have observed. Please join me for a terrific adventure.

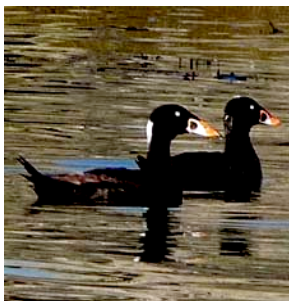
